53rd COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN

In conjunction with the 53rd United Nations Commission on the Status of Women, the Commonwealth Foundation held a symposium: **ENDING AIDS STIGMA: Women and men working together.**



The symposium was co-chaired by Ambassador Robert Aisi from the Permanent Mission of Papua New Guinea to the United Nations and Anisha Rajapakse, Program Manager Human Development at the Commonwealth Foundation. Sharon Robinson acted as Consultant to the Commonwealth Foundation in the preparation of the symposium.

Speakers included:

- Dean Peacock from the Sonke Gender Justice Network of South Africa who spoke about innovative ways of engaging men in ending AIDS stigma.
- Lisa Williams-Lahari from the Pacific Islands AIDS Foundation who shared outcomes from a recent survey on AIDS stigma and discrimination in the South Pacific.
- Jill Iliffe from the Commonwealth Nurses Federation who spoke of nursing and midwifery initiatives to reduce the stigma and discrimination associated with HIV and AIDS.
- Caroline Pontefract and Jyotsna Jha from the Commonwealth Secretariat who launched a publication on teacher training for effective HIV and gender education.

WORLD HEALTH DAY 2009

World Health Day is celebrated on 7 April each year. The theme for World Health Day 2009 is: *Save lives: make hospitals safe in emergencies.* Around the world, events will focus on being prepared for emergencies, constructing safe health facilities and recognising health workers and emergency response teams who look after people who have been affected by disasters. The World Health Organisation was created on 7 April in 1948.

PLAN OF ACTION FOR GENDER EQUALITY 2005-2015

Prior to the 53rd UN Commission on the Status of Women, the Commonwealth Secretariat met with Ministers and officials for Women's Affairs from Commonwealth countries and with civil society representatives to provide feedback on progress in implementing the Commonwealth Plan of Action for Gender Equality 2005-2015. The meeting was chaired by Caroline Pontefract, Director Social Transformation Programs Division of the Commonwealth Secretariat.

The Plan of Action covers four main areas:

- Gender, democracy, peace and conflict,
- Gender, human rights and law,
- Gender, poverty eradication and economic empowerment, and
- Gender and HIV and AIDS.

The theme for IND 2009 is: *Delivering quality, serving communities: nurses leading care innovations.* International Midwives Day is celebrated each year on 5 May.

THE COMMONWEALTH TURNS 60

The 60th anniversary of the adoption of the London Declaration by Commonwealth Prime Ministers falls on 28 April 2009. On this day the British Commonwealth came to an end and the modern Commonwealth of 'freely and equally associated' states came into being. There are currently fifty three member states of the Commonwealth.

The theme of Commonwealth Day: 'the commonwealth @ 60 - serving a new generation' provides a chance to look back, but also a chance to look at the work of the Commonwealth now and in the future.
