Singapore is at the top of the high income countries; Malaysia at the top of the upper middle income countries; China is at the top of the lower middle income countries (India is the top Commonwealth country in the lower middle income group); with Viet Nam at the top of the low income countries (the Gambia is the top Commonwealth country in the low income group).

The Gambia 12-19 March 2011

Maternal and Child Morbidity and Mortality in West Africa



Over 600 nurses and midwives from West Africa attended the West African College of Nursing (WACN) meeting in the Gambia. At the meeting fellows were inducted into the College faculties of Medical and Surgical Nursing; Maternal and Child Health; Mental Health and Psychiatric Nursing; Community Health Nursing; and Administration, Management and Education. The opening ceremony was attended by Her Excellency, the Vice President of the Republic of The Gambia who noted that even though the Gambia provided free maternal and child health care and had improved transport to care, inadequate incentives and remuneration for nurses, midwives and other health professionals and timely referral of women with difficult labour were still issues to be addressed. The President of WACN Mrs Dedeh Jones said, nurses and midwives in West Africa can make a big difference to the reduction of maternal and infant morbidity and mortality. She called on all governments to provide an enabling working environment for nurses and midwives. Mrs. Alice Dorkoa Asare-Allotey, President of the Ghana Nurses Association and CNF board member for West Africa represented the CNF at the meeting.
